

A Guide To Bacs Software

Bacs is an acronym for banks automated clearing and was originally a system established by the UK banks for processing financial transactions. The majority of direct debits and direct credits made in the UK are made using the Bacs system. Bacs payments take three working days to clear. On the first day, they entered into the system, the second day they are processed, and finally they were cleared on the third day, which is when they reach their destination.

A Direct Debit is an instruction from a customer to their bank or building society authorising an organization to collect amounts from their account. They are used to make sure regular payments for things such as household bills. More than 5 billion Direct Debit payments are made by Bacs a year and most adults in the UK have at least one Direct Debit set up on their bank account. Ferries Direct credit is mainly used to pay wages and salaries. In 2007, more than 90% of workers in the United Kingdom have been paid using this method.

Bacs electronic payments using the software have become increasingly popular in recent years because of the convenience associated with them and the growing demand for telephone and internet banking. Payments and receipts via Bacs greatly reduce operating costs compared to more traditional methods such as cash or cheques, this is mainly to the reduction of administration and costs associated with preparing and processing payments.

As for a bank to set up a direct debit or credit for you, it is also possible to make payments through the Bacs system using special software designed to this effect. To use the system Ferries, a company must have an account with one of the major banks that sponsor their application. The only way that it is possible for companies to make payments in this manner is using software from the list of solution providers Ferries Approved (BASS). Each bank will have its own recommended software provider, although it is possible for a company to use an independent contractor, if they wish.

Ferries Approved Solution Provider is a software developer and supplier of software that can provide, support and consultancy services to Bacs clients to use the service Bacs. Each vendor has its products and services evaluated by Bacs using a set of standards and criteria. It is important that businesses use a single vendor that is fully approved by Bacs. Bacs approved software vendors can be recognized by the software vendors approved Ferries logo on their publications. Only approved suppliers are allowed to display the logo, and a full list of them can be found on the website Ferries. If a company does not appear on the site, although they were not approved.

If a company wants to make payments on behalf of other companies or individuals, it must become a become Ferries Approved Bureau and the Bureau of purchase special software. The criteria required to become an office Ferries are even more stringent than for a normal application and include a safety inspection that costs more than 4000 pounds. Some companies have set up an office in charge of a commission other companies to make payments on their behalf, it is a common practice in the recruitment industry where temporary employment agencies can outsource their payroll.

As standard software Ferries, there are Bacs software available that integrate directly with the accounting software, the most common being the Sage accounting software. This can be accomplished in two ways: The first way is more common to export a file from the accounting software that can be read in the Bacs software. There is also a type of Bacs software, known as Direct Entry Ferries, which not only pulls data directly from Sage software, but makes the display in the Sage ledgers after payment has been made, the safeguarding of a large amount of admin time.
